There are different ways to become an accredited Masters Swimming Club Coach. Following are the Pathway Groups and Steps to assist you with working out which way best suits you.

Masters Swimming Club Coach - Accreditation Pathway Guide

STEP 1

Applicants for the Masters Club Coach Accreditation must fully meet the requirements of ONE of the following groups prior to registering for the Club Coach Course online component and Workshop. (please tick, include evidence and have verification signed off when complete)

<p>GROUP D</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p>If you are a SAL Bronze (or higher) Licence Holder or have significant prior learning and experience relevant to coaching adult swimmers you can apply for Recognition of Current Competency.</p> <p>The process is outlined in the Masters Swimming Australia (MSA) website https://mastersswimming.org.au/coaching-and-officials/coaching/</p> <p>You can progress directly to Step 7 and submit your RCC application form.</p>

STEP 2

Complete the Online Masters Swimming Club Coach Course

(<https://learning.swimming.org.au>) **Please note the Online Course cost as of 2020 - \$95**

You will need to register for a log in and password and pay to enrol for the course.

This online component can take between 4 and 15 hours to complete depending on your competency. You must print your completion certificate and bring it to the Club Coach Course Workshop.

This online component can be completed at any time that suits you prior to a workshop being scheduled.

This must be completed before progressing to **Step 3**

STEP 3

Attend the full day Club Coach Course Workshop. You will need to register for this course and there will be a fee to attend. Your club may reimburse you for this cost once you are qualified. The Club Coach Course is a full day workshop comprising adult coaching theory, stroke fundamentals and a poolside practical assessment. You **MUST** have completed all components of **Steps 1 and 2** in order to attend the workshop.

STEP 4

Complete and return the Club Coach Course Workbook and Assessments. You will be issued with your Workbook and Assessments at the beginning of the Club Coach Workshop. You will be able to fill in much of workbook during the day, however, there will be some additional assessments to be completed after the workshop. Your completed workbook is to be returned to the Course Coordinator or State/Territory Coaching representative by the date they nominate. This is usually within 3-4 months of the workshop. Your workbook will be marked and returned to you for your reference.
You can complete this workbook while completing your hours in **Step 5**.

STEP 5

Complete and log your on-deck pool hours. You will need to complete 30 hours of coaching adults in a squad under the supervision of a qualified mentor coach. You have one year to complete these hours and return your Record of Practical Coaching Log – Club Coach (30hrs) signed by your Coach Mentor or Club Official. If you have been coaching or assisting on pool deck prior to the Club Coach Course, these hours can be included in your 30hrs provided they are fairly recent and signed off by your Coach Mentor. You can complete your CPR course, **Step 6**, while finishing these hours.

STEP 6

Complete a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Course (CPR). This must be delivered by a recognized Registered Training Organisation. You must provide a copy of your CPR training certificate in order to progress to **Step 7**. CPR qualifications expire after one year and must be current for your coaching qualification to continue to be valid.

STEP 7

Ensure all documents have been submitted and completed within the stipulated time frames.

The documentation will be:

EITHER

- ✓ your application for RCC, associated evidence **AND** current CPR training certificate **AND** the signed Coached Code of Conduct Form

OR

- ✓ your completed CCC Workbook and Assessments **AND**
- ✓ your signed record of pool deck hours **AND**
- ✓ your Practical Coaching Log – Club Coach (30hrs) **AND**
- ✓ your current CPR Training Certificate
- ✓ your signed Coaches Code of Conduct Form

Your Club Coach Course Accreditation Certificate will be issued by Masters Swimming Australia and will be valid for 4 years from issue.

Attend Professional Development courses to maintain your skills. It is a requirement of re-accreditation every 4 years that you have attended Professional Development Workshops and have been an active coach.
